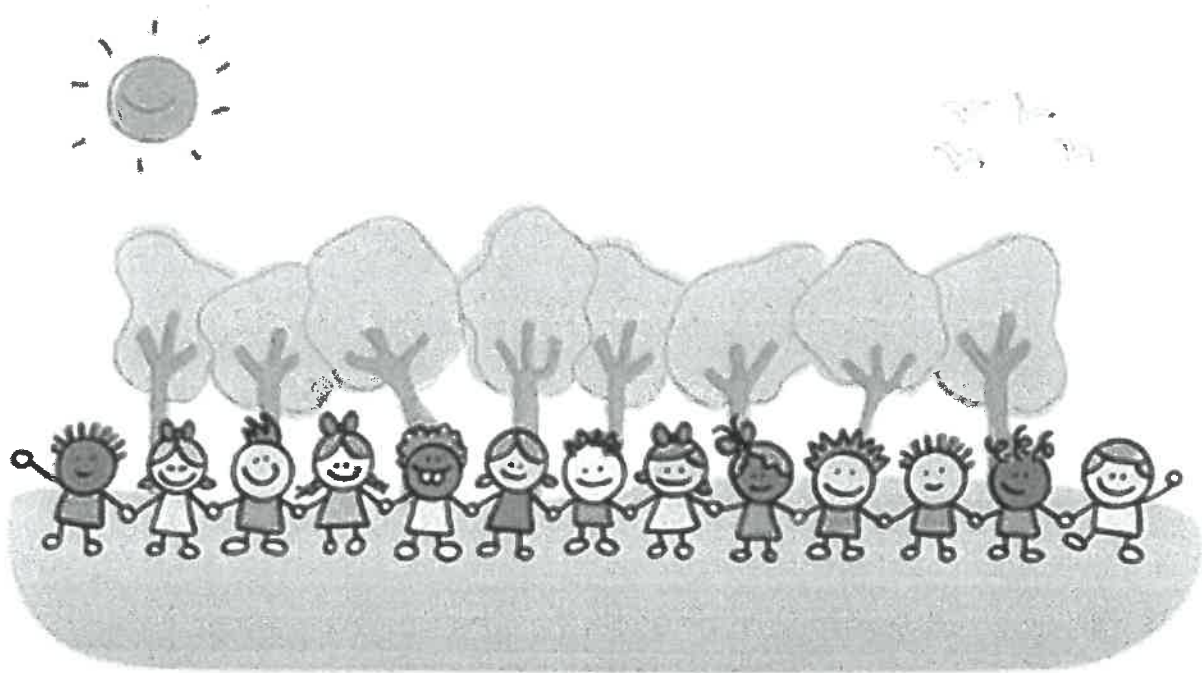


First Grade Summer Enrichment Packet

Math: There is a fun math log with activities for each month. As your child completes one of the activities, he or she can color in the rectangle!
